# 4. Estuary Blueprint Progress Report

- Caitlin Sweeney presented highlights from the Progress Report
- All 25 actions are showing progress, with 8 exceeding 50% completion
- 87% of the 126 tasks within the 25 actions have been started
- We are about 40% of the way towards full completion of the Blueprint within the 5 year timeframe
- Michael Germeraad, Resilience Planner with ABAG/MTC, presented on Task 3-5, the refresh
  of the Priority Conservation Area Program
- Todd Hallenbeck and Phoenix Armenta with BCDC, presented on Task 2-1 the completion of the Community-Based Organization Directory Map

### 5. Estuary Blueprint Implementation: Action 8 - Wetlands Regional Monitoring Program

- Sasha Harris-Lovett, Alex Thomson, Hannah Kempf, SFEP, and Donna Ball, SFEI, presented
- Sasha Harris-Lovett spoke on mission to deliver coordinated regional monitoring of SF Estuary's wetlands
- Update on new SFEI Staff Scientists Lisa Beers and Aviva Rossi
- Funding updates SFBRA & EPA grants awarded with in kind and matching support from partners
- Alex Thomson spoke about monitoring how people interact with wetlands
- Donna Ball gave a presentation on wetland tracking tools including Lidar for the whole Estuary next year

#### 6. California Climate Bond

• Josh Quigley, Save the Bay, presented on the Prop 4 Climate Bond on November's ballot, including the history of getting the bond on the ballot and what the bond measure includes.

### 7. IC Member Announcements

- Warner Chabot reported on a 9-week virtual course at UC Santa Cruz for practitioners, includes a 3-day work session. Scrambling to find \$4,000 scholarships to provide to CBO and Tribal Community Leaders
- Stuart Siegel reported on staffing change at SF Estuary Research Reserve with Matt Ferner as the new Reserve Director. Stuart will be switching back to coastal resilience projects
- Amanda Bohl reported on the Bay Delta Science Conference which will be back in person on September 30<sup>th</sup>. Highlighted the call for posters.
- Lorien Fono reported on the SF bay Watershed Permit adopted on July 10<sup>th</sup>. Nutrients in wastewater must be reduced. Cost estimate is 11 billion. No new funding but 10-year timeline to achieve these reductions. Seeking to extend timeline.
- Jessica Fain reported that BCDC will host first ever Bay Adapt Summit. Rising together at the Exploratorium. BCDC is moving forward with the regional sea level rise adaptation plan.

- SB272 must create guidelines by the end of this year for shoreline adaptation plans. These will be available for public review in September
- Dana Michaels reported on upcoming funding opportunity under BIL for SF Bay water quality improvement. Shoreline resilience in under-served communities. Open in October 2024 and closes in May 2025. Awarding 14 million through 2025/26
